

Dr Janet Xuanli Liao by training is a specialist on international relations and China's foreign policy decision-making. She obtained her PhD degree in International Relation from the University of Hong Kong. Prior to that, she held M.A. & B.A in History from Peking University, and M.A. in International Relations from the International University of Japan.

Before joining the Centre in 2001, Dr Liao worked as Teaching Assistant and Lecturer at the History Department and the Institute of International Relations of Peking University, China. She also worked as a Research Associate of the CEPMLP between 2000 and 2001, on a joint research project regarding "Strategic Implications of China's Energy Needs", together with Dr Philip Andrews-Speed at the CEPMLP, and Dr Roland Dannreuther from Edinburgh University. The research has been published by the International Institute for Strategic Studies as an Adelphi Paper in 2002.

Dr Liao's current research interests include Chinese think tanks and China's foreign policy decision-making, energy security and China's international energy policy analysis, Sino-Japanese political/energy relations, and, energy and geopolitics in East and Central Asia. She has been a visiting researcher to the International Institute for Strategic studies, the Institute of Energy Economics of Japan, and the Silk Road Studies Program of the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute at Uppsala University, Sweden.

Dr Liao has been invited to speak at various conferences/workshops in European countries, the United states, and China, about China's international energy strategy and Sino-Japanese relations and East Asian stability. She also consults governments, think tanks, international petroleum companies and international organization on issues related to energy security, China's energy-led foreign policy, and East Asian energy and international relations. In addition to her teaching at the CEPMLP, Dr Liao also gave seminars at other universities in the UK, Portugal and Sweden on the issues related to her expertise.
